To achieve this goal, the city has implemented a range of innovative transportation programs, offering discounted access to services like Capital Bikeshare, dockless scooters, Metro, and others.



Affordable

Special discount programs are available for eligible individuals to use Capital Bikeshare, dockless bikes or scooters, and the Metro.



Accessible

You can find a dockless bike or scooter, ride Capital Bikeshare, or Metro across all eight wards of the District.

CAPITAL BIKESHARE

Capital Bikeshare for All allows those who qualify for certain state or federal assistance programs (SNAP, TANF, etc.) to sign up for Capital Bikeshare online or join through a community partner. If eligible, you can get an annual membership for just \$5!

ELECTRIC SCOOTERS

All scooter operators offer a low-income customer plan to provide access to dockless bikes and scooters. If eligible, you can also get **FREE** unlimited 30-minute trips.

RIDESHARE

The LyftUp program provides **FREE** and discounted car rides to unemployed individuals, low-income families, and seniors for essential needs like job interviews and trainings, grocery stores, financial assistance appointments, emergency shelter, and more.

WMATA/METRO

Metrobus and Metrorail have a reduced fare program for people with disabilities and passengers age 65 or older. Those customers who qualify will be issued a Reduced Fare SmarTrip® photo ID card. Metro also offers 50% off Metrobus and Metrorail trips for those enrolled in SNAP through Metro Lift.
